About Lindström



Incorporated in 1894, Lindström, Minnesota was first settled by Daniel Lindstrom who left Sweden for America in 1853. Among the Swedish emigrants was Erik Norelius, whose personal journals (documented in part) formed the basis of Vilhelm Moberg's novels of the Swedish emigration to America. Moberg's fictional heroes, Karl-Oskar and Kristina Nilsson, are memorialized in statue at the west end of downtown as a tribute to the early Swedish immigrants whose descendants continue to populate our area. A photo of Karl and Kristina's statue is shown on page 1 of this publication. Additional statues of Lindström's historical figures are located north of Karl & Kristina, across the street at Oberstar Plaza (show in background of this page).

City Ordinances

WINTER PARKING

- From **November 1st to April 15th** there is **NO PARKING** allowed on city streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am or during snow events. This allows our crew to be able to plow in front of your house without having to plow around your vehicles. ([Ordinance 72.02](#))
- **During a snow event**, please avoid parking on city streets until the plows have cleared the road.
- If you live downtown and use the city-owned Park Street Parking Lot for parking, you will need to obtain a winter parking pass. Please contact the [Lakes Area Police Department](#) for more information using their non-emergency number 651-257-0622 or stop in at [City Hall](#).



WINTER SHOVELING

Property owners are responsible to clear the sidewalks adjacent to their property of snow and ice **within 24 hours** of a snowfall event. For the benefit and safety of all pedestrians, please adhere to this City Ordinance. ([Ordinances 93.01 & 93.18](#))

If you have a fire hydrant in your yard, please keep a 3-foot path cleared of snow around the hydrant, clear the hydrant of ice and snow, and keep a path shoveled from the hydrant to the street- this is the responsibility of the property owner.

Firefighters need to be able to **locate AND access** the fire hydrant quickly in case there is an emergency. Do your part and reveal the red. *Thank you!*



PET LICENSING

All dogs AND cats in the City of Lindström that are 6 months and older must be licensed annually. Licenses are valid through the end of the calendar year. New licenses and renewals can be purchased for a nominal fee at Lindström City Hall.

A current rabies **Certificate of Vaccination** document is **required** at the time of application, which provides proof of vaccination as well as the vaccination serial number. A receipt or statement for rabies vaccination from your vet clinic **does not qualify** as proof of rabies vaccination.

The City of Lindström and the Lakes Area Police Department keep track of the numbered tags and licenses. If your pet strays or is found by others, having a tag assists in getting your pet back to you. If the City/LAPD detains an unlicensed animal, there will be additional costs to the owner to have Animal Control hold the animal until it is claimed.

Please be a courteous pet owner:

- Bring a baggie or other device to clean up should your pet make a deposit along the way.
- Animals in heat must be confined and kept away from other animals.
- Pets must be leashed **at all times**, unless confined inside an owner's yard.
- Don't allow your dog to bark repeatedly.
- Feces must be removed from the owner's property within two days during the summer, and within three days during the winter.
- Anyone with more than three dogs must obtain a Kennel License in addition to the regular dog licenses.

The City of Lindström also requires permits for the keeping of bees and chickens. ([Ordinance 92.15](#))



City Ordinances

STORAGE OF SEASONAL & RECREATIONAL ACCESSORY BUILDINGS

The City of Lindström has an ordinance regarding the outside storage/parking of vehicles and recreational equipment in residential areas. Please refer to [Ordinance 154.052](#) regarding unused vehicles, snowmobiles, boats, recreational equipment, location of stored vehicles, accessory buildings, street parking, and limited permits for guest vehicles, etc. If you have questions, please call City Hall at (651) 257-0620.

OPERATION OF SNOWMOBILES, ATV'S AND GOLF CARTS

Snowmobiles, ATV's and golf carts shall only be allowed to travel on city streets during the winter season, beginning November 1st through March 31st of each year. Between November 1st and March 31st, snowmobiles, ATV's and golf carts may operate upon the most right-hand lane of a municipal street or alley and may, in passing or making a left turn, operate on other lanes which are used for vehicle traffic in the same direction for purposes of going to or returning from a non-highway area of permissible operation by the most direct route. Snowmobiles, ATV's and golf carts are not allowed to travel on sidewalks, in city parks, or on private property without permission.

RIGHT-OF-WAY PLANTING

The City of Lindström prohibits planting of trees or other vegetation in the boulevard (road right-of-way). Trees and other vegetation may be planted and maintained in drainage and utility easements without a permit from the City at the risk of the property owner and provided that the trees or vegetation do not interfere with access to or use of the easement. ([Ordinance 90.23](#))

WEED ELIMINATION & GRASS CUTTING

Weeds and grasses are not allowed to exceed a height of **8 inches**. Any expenses incurred by the City when performing enforcement and/or cutting will be imposed on the property owner. ([Ordinances 93.35 - 93.43](#))

[Noxious weeds and rank vegetation](#) (click for definition) are considered a nuisance according to [City Code](#). Property owners shall prevent the growth of noxious weeds and remove all noxious weeds on land outside of the traveled portion of any street or alley within city limits. If said weeds are not destroyed by the property owner, the City may remove them at the property owner's expense.

The term "weeds" does **NOT** include shrubs, trees, cultivated plants or crops. [Prairies](#), as well as [butterfly & pollinator gardens](#) are considered cultivated plants **if** the vegetation is **not listed** in the definition of "[noxious weeds and rank vegetation](#)", **AND** are planted in a **cultivated manner**.

RECREATIONAL FIRES

Recreational fires must be small- no more than 3 feet in height and diameter. A non-combustible fire ring shall completely surround the fire area, and must be depressed below the ground. Materials such as cement, brick, blocks, etc. are recommended materials. Fires may not be located closer than 25 feet from any structure. Additional conditions apply. Recreational fires are not allowed when a burning ban has been officially declared. See [Ordinances 93.60 - 93.70](#) for more information.

City Services

CITY MAINTENANCE SERVICES

The **Public Works Department** is responsible for many services within the City of Lindström. The major service departments include: streets, water, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, parks, equipment, and facilities. SCHEDULED MAINTENANCE

Fire hydrant flushing and street sweeping occurs in late April into May, in September into early October, and throughout the summer as needed. If “spitting” or discoloration from your tap occurs during hydrant flushing, run your water for a short period of time to clear the pipes in your home. Avoid parking on the street during street sweeping if possible, as this will result in cleaner streets.

REPORTING A STREET LIGHT OUTAGE



Nearly all of the street lights in Lindström are the responsibility of Xcel Energy, EXCEPT for the ornamental lights in downtown (shown in picture). To report an outage for the style shown in the picture, contact City Hall at (651) 257-0620 or contactus@cityoflindstrom.us

All other street light outages need to be reported directly to **Xcel Energy**. You can report the outage using Xcel’s online reporting form. An update will be emailed to you upon request. You can also call Xcel to report the outage at 1-800-960-6235.

REPORTING A WATER OR SEWER EMERGENCY

If a sewer backup occurs, or if you have a water-related emergency in your home, on your property, or observe what appears to be a water-main break, please call City Hall immediately at **651-257-0620**.

Hours: Monday – Thursday 7:00am-4:30pm; Friday from 7:00a.m.-noon.

After hours, or on weekends, or Federal Holidays, call Chisago County Dispatch at **651-257-4100**. They will dispatch a City Public Works crew to assess the emergency water or sewer situation.

City Services

CITY WATER & SEWER SERVICES

The city has two wells and a half million-gallon water tower that was built in 1991. The tap water hardness is 100ppm (mg/l) or 5.8 Grains per Gallon, which classifies our water as “moderately hard” (see chart below). Our water pH is 8.1. Water and sewer rates are reviewed annually by the City Council and revised as needed. Visit our website for current rates (see bottom right of this page).

The City is able to read your meter remotely. Meters are read each quarter, as close to the end of the quarter as possible. If you have questions about your water meter, meter readings, and/or utility bills please contact City Hall.

If you have a **sewer or water-related emergency**, contact City Hall **immediately** at (651) 257-0620 Monday - Thursday from 7am - 4:30pm and Friday 7am - noon. After hours, or on weekends or holidays, call Chisago County Dispatch at (651) 257-4100. They will send a City Public Works crew to assess the situation.

If you need to update your utility billing contact information, have general questions or if you have a sewer or water issue that is NOT an emergency, please contact City Hall during regular business hours (651) 257-0620.

Area Services

LAKES AREA COMPOST SITE

The cities of Lindström, Stacy, Wyoming and Chisago City operate an Area Compost Site. Residents may use the facility at no charge (proof of address may be required, such as a driver's license, water/sewer utility bill or a property tax statement). Non-residents may use the facility for a fee.

The Compost Site opens in mid-April and closes for the season in mid-November (weather permitting). The site may be closed on Holidays and during inclement weather. Follow the [City of Lindström on Facebook](#) and sign up for the City's [E-Subscribe](#) notifications for updates (*see page 1 to scan QR Codes*).

No commercial services will be permitted to haul to or from the site.

Seasonal operating hours are (weather permitting):

Wednesdays 2pm - 7pm (or dusk)

Saturdays 9am - 4pm

Sundays 1pm - 4pm

Accepted compostable materials are: leaves, grass clippings, and brush (up to 3" in diameter). Bags must be removed if they are not bio-degradable. Place materials only where designated. See website or call City Hall for more information.

Materials that are NOT accepted are: dimensional lumber, household trash, tires, appliances, etc. No dumping of any materials (trash or organics) outside of the fence.

Wood chips and black dirt are FREE, when available. Bring your own tools- gloves, shovel, etc. Assistance in loading and unloading is generally NOT available. Occasionally the Boy Scouts are there to help, but only intermittently.

Sometimes the site is very muddy. Please be aware of your vehicle's capabilities.

The site is located right next to the Chisago Lakes Joint Sewage Treatment Plant, on the east side of County Road 24.

Area Services

LAKES AREA POLICE DEPARTMENT (LAPD)

The Lakes Area Police Department is a joint service provided by the Cities of Lindström and Chisago City. It includes 14 full-time sworn Officers, 6 part-time non-sworn reserve Officers and is headquartered out of Lindström City Hall (as of 2022). Lakes Area Officers are dispatched through the Chisago County 911 Center (located in Center City), and are available 24-hours a day, seven days a week. The Department responds to all police, fire, and medical emergencies within the city, and has staff dedicated to investigative and code enforcement assignments.

The Department encourages ongoing positive interaction between the Department and area youth. The Chisago Lakes School District contracts with the Department to provide two full time School Resource Officers who work within all the schools in the district, as well as Trio Wolf Creek Distance learning, and the Pathways to Change Program. Officers teach D.A.R.E. and National Child Safety programs in our local school system as well as partnering with the DNR to teach Hunter, Snowmobile, and ATV Safety classes. The Department also partners with other area law enforcement to teach Safety Camp for youth and Citizen's Academy for adults. To promote safe neighborhoods, the Departments also offers Lindström residents a chance to participate in National Night Out, Coffee with a Cop, and Community Watch programs.

LINDSTRÖM FIRE DEPARTMENT (LFD)

The Lindström Fire Department has been serving the community since 1855, and currently has approximately 25 Volunteer Fire Fighters. LFD is very involved in the local community, including Lindström's Karl Oskar Days town festival, October Fire Prevention events, and numerous other public relations events throughout the year.

The Fire Hall building is currently located at 12955 Lake Blvd., but the Lindström Fire Department will be relocated to their new building in late fall or early winter of 2022. The new Fire Hall is located just 1 block south of Lindström City Hall, and meets the growing needs of the area as well as providing the necessary space and upgrades for today's equipment and safety protocols.

State law requires that when you change residences, you must change the address on your Driver's License or State ID within 30 days.
