A new trail bridge will be built on the west side of Bull Lake this winter, which will complete the trail loop in Lindström's Allemansrätt Wilderness Park.

Enjoy Christmas music, and stay warm with hot chocolate, coffee, and a bonfire! All events will take place outdoors, so be sure to bundle up. See you there!



How can I pay my water bill?

Water/sewer bills are sent quarterly, and for your convenience we have many payment options.

Pav Online

To view or pay your utility bill online, go to the Utility Billing page on our website. Click on the menu item to be re-directed to our payment processor's website. You do not have to pay online to view/receive your bill online.

- View or pay your utility bill online or on the app.
- Sign up for E-bills; you will receive an email each billing cycle letting you know your bill is ready to view.

Pay immediately or schedule a payment with a debit/credit card, or checking or savings account. You can also set up Auto-Pay.

Pay Using Mobile App

You can also view and pay your utility bill by downloading "PSN Payments" from the App Store® or Google PlayTM. If you registered online first, use those login credentials.

Pay Using PSN Payments Phone Payment System

Call 1-877-885-7968. Have your bill handy to provide your customer account number. On the first call you will register. Future calls are just four steps.

Direct Payment

We can set-up your account to automatically withdraw your payment from your checking or savings account on the due date.

Other Payment Options


- Credit/debit cards, checks and cash are accepted in person at City Hall during regular business hours.
- Credit/debit cards are also accepted over the phone at City Hall 651-257-0620 during regular business hours.
- Checks are accepted by mail (13292 Sylvan Ave., Lindström, MN 55045) or in the drop box located outside of City Hall.

Mailbox Requirements

Winter is approaching which means snow plows will be out and we want to remind everyone of the mailbox requirements.

- The base of the box should be 48"-50" above street level, the mailbox should be secured to the base and post, and the post should be in good condition.
- The post must be 20" back from the curb. The face of the mailbox should line up with the curb.
- The snowplow wing needs the 48" height clearance to avoid hitting the box and the 20" from the curb to clear the post. The city does not assume liability for mailboxes damaged during plowing operations unless it is determined
- the plow made direct contact with a mailbox that is properly installed using the standard 4 x 4 post and metal box requirements.
- There should not be any plastic newspaper tubes or attachments to the mailbox below the 44" minimum height requirement.



Keep Your Storm Drain Clean

Storm drain systems are designed to move excess rain and ground water from paved streets, parking lots, sidewalks, and walking paths. These storm drains are usually fed by street gutters, which are often fed by excess water flow coming from guttering systems on both houses and commercial buildings. In order to help prevent yard and street flooding, please periodically check the storm water drains in front of your house for debris and clear off as needed.

Winter Reminders

Winter Parking

• From November 1st to April 15th there is **NO PARKING** allowed on city streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am or during snow events. This allows our crew to be able to plow in front of your house without having to plow around your vehicles.

Snowmobiles

- Snowmobiles are not allowed to travel on sidewalks, in city parks, or on private property without permission.
- A snowmobile may operate upon the most right -hand lane of a municipal street or alley & may, in passing or making a left turn, operate on other lanes which are used for vehicle traffic in the same direction for purposes of going to or returning from a non-highway area of permissible operation by the most direct route.
- Snowmobiles shall only be allowed to travel on City Streets during the winter season, beginning November 1st through March 31st of each year.

Snow Plow

- Consider replacing your mailbox with a swing style post. This helps prevent it being broken by the weight of the snow.
- If your lot is curved, please place reflective markers near the curb to help guide the snowplows.
- DO NOT plow or shovel snow across streets or into a Right of Way. It is illegal.
- Any personal property located within the Right of Way, including garbage cans, are subject to plowing damage. Garbage cans need to be placed in the driveway, not in the street.

Winter Shoveling

 Snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours of a snowfall.



- Property owners are responsible for the
 - sidewalks that are adjacent to their property.
- Help your neighbors out, especially if you know they are gone or are elderly. Consider clearing their sidewalks & driveways. Thanks for being a good neighbor!
