When hot cooking oil cools down, it solidifies and sticks to the inside walls of your kitchen pipes. Over

pipes. Over time, the solids can build up and clog your pipes. This

can lead to backups, flooding, & huge plumbing bills.

Cooking oil can also damage our

sewer system, including our lift stations, resulting in costly cleaning and repairs.

<u>Tips on how to safely</u> <u>dispose of used cooking oil:</u>

- Strain it so there are no food particles
- Put it in a sealed plastic container (glass will work as long as it has a lid)
- Let it harden in the container, then double bag it

Throw it in your trash;
 <u>Chisago County Hazardous</u>
 <u>Waste</u> will also accept cooking oil (in large amounts)

Lindström's Coffee Pot Water Tower

Our famous downtown coffee pot water tower is located in *Kaffe Kanna Park*, on the north side of the city-owned Municipal Bar.

The city's original water tower was constructed of wood and steel, and was replaced in 1908.



In 1920, a 500 candlepower light was installed on top of the tank, which could be seen as far as North Branch and Forest Lake! The light was nicknamed the "Star of Lindstrom".

A fire siren was added to the

structure in 1933, and the 1908 wooden tank was replaced with a steel tank in the 1940's.

By 1991 it was time for a larger capacity water tower. Instead of tearing the old one down, it was converted to the coffee pot structure you see today.

Marlene Smith of Plastic Products Company donated \$15,000 towards the conversion. This covered almost the entire cost of the project.

The project included adding the handle, spout and knob, repainting the structure, and adding the hand lettering "Välkommen till Lindström" and rosemaling designs to the tower's reservoir.

It has become a Lindström icon, and has recently been featured on the news, in a

Minnesota Calendar, and several travel publications.

When the city logo was updated last year, the coffee pot water tower was made a key element in the design. We look forward to enjoying this tribute to our city's history and Swedish heritage for many years to come.

City Projects & Development Updates

Meredees/Peninsula- The Developer stated that production is now in queue at the factory, despite material shortages.

Morning Sun Phase 3 & 4- Phase 3 has only five lots remaining. The developer will extend the road this spring, and then start on Phase 4, which will consist of 22 units. Phase 4 is the final phase of this development.

Golf Estates- The first home is going up. 32 lots remain.

Albrecht Land- Next is annexation and final plat.

Olinda Apartments- Projected occupancy is end of January, early February.

Twin Oaks/Lyman Court Phase Two- This development, off of County Road 19, is a replat of 11 lots with 4 additional lots, for a total of 15 new townhome lots. The 11 lots to the south are available now, after the developer was able to solve the gas main issue.

Glader Blvd. Linn Lake Preserve/Olinda Trail- Staff is reviewing a development concept from a developer.

Veteran's Housing (Tingsryd Gardens)- A preliminary plat for 8 townhomes, which will surround the Community Garden that is across from the new Fire Hall location, was submitted to the City for consideration.

Allemansratt Bridge- Progress continues. The boardwalk is nearly complete. Bridge work started with installation of the helical piles.

Olinda Trail Trail- Plans are complete. City Council authorized going to bid (opening in March), following final MnDot approvals.

Lindstrom Fire Hall- The block walls are up. There will be a brief break in the construction process during February. The wall panels, trusses and roof will arrive during first quarter of 2022. Completion is hopefully in December 2022.

Lindstrom Police Hall- The project was included on the Governor's bonding list in mid-January.

Newlander/Elm Street- A total reconstruct for the section of road is anticipated this summer. Plans are at 50%, and another neighborhood meeting will be scheduled for February. Following resident comment, plans with be finalized and presented to City Council.

Peninsula Ave./Irene Court- A reclaim is scheduled for this year- no dates yet. This will be similar to last year's Cedar Ridge project.

Understanding Our Local Government Structure

Lindstrom was incorporated in 1893 as a city, authorized through State Statute and organized as a Plan A.

That means we have a Mayor and City Council, and a City Administrator as the administrative heads of the City. The Mayor and four City Council Members are elected by you, to lead the City.

To help them make decisions they appoint Advisory Commissions: Planning, Parks and Economic Development Authority. The Council, similar to a Board of

Directors of a private company, has a business plan called the Comprehensive Plan. This plan outlines the Vision, Mission and Values of the City. Our Comprehensive Plan envisions a "Great Place." A place where anyone living, visiting or working in our community would comment, "This is a great place!" The Council outlined in the Comprehensive Plan what it will take to be that place.

Keep Your Fire Hydrant Cleared

If you have a fire hydrant in your yard, please keep a 3-foot path cleared of snow around the hydrant, clear the hydrant of ice and snow, and keep a path shoveled from the hydrant to the street. Firefighters need to be able to **locate AND access** the fire hydrant quickly in case there is an emergency. Do your part and reveal the red. *Thank you!*



Winter Reminders

Winter Parking

• From November 1st to April 15th there is **NO PARKING** allowed on city streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am or during snow events. This allows our crew to be able to plow in front of your house without having to plow around your vehicles.

Snowmobiles

- Snowmobiles are not allowed to travel on sidewalks, in city parks, or on private property without permission.
- A snowmobile may operate upon the most right -hand lane of a municipal street or alley & may, in passing or making a left turn, operate on other lanes which are used for vehicle traffic in the same direction for purposes of going to or returning from a non-highway area of permissible operation by the most direct route.
- Snowmobiles shall only be allowed to travel on City Streets during the winter season, beginning November 1st through March 31st of each year.



Snow Plow

- Consider replacing your mailbox with a swing style post. This helps prevent it being broken by the weight of the snow.
- If your lot is curved, please place reflective markers near the curb to help guide the snowplows.
- DO NOT plow or shovel snow across streets or into a Right of Way. It is illegal.
- Any personal property located within the Right of Way, including garbage cans, are subject to plowing damage. Garbage cans need to be placed in the driveway, not in the street.

Winter Shoveling

- Snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours of a snowfall.
- Property owners are responsible for the sidewalks that are adjacent to their property.
- Help your neighbors out, especially if you know they are gone or are elderly. Consider clearing their sidewalks & driveways. Thanks for being a good neighbor!
