City Planning & Priorities: What's In Store For 2024

An Update From Mayor **Judy Chartrand**



The late Yogi Berra once said, "If you don't know where you are going, you'll end up someplace else." To make sure we don't end up "someplace else", the Lindström City Council spent quite a bit of 2023 determining where we are going as a City.

In 2023, we welcomed a new City Administrator (Dan Undem),

developed a 10-year financial plan and a 10-year road maintenance and repair plan.

The Commercial/Industrial Business Task Force completed their work in exploring options for expanding the City's commercial tax base.

The Council and City Commissions came together to identify Lindström's Strengths, Weakness, Opportunities, and Threats by completing a SWOT analysis.

Meetings with business owners were also held to better understand their needs and priorities, and in November the **Budget Open House** at City Hall gave residents an opportunity to review the aforementioned plans and offer their input.

All this work led up to the 2024 budget approval which represented a 7.94% increase, lower than the previous 3 year's

Ice Shelters & Fishing License Reminders

ICE IS NEVER 100% SAFE

There have been numerous reports of thin ice in various areas on our local lakes. Even in ideal conditions, ice is never considered 100% safe.

FISHING LICENSE RENEWALS

You need to buy a Minnesota fishing license if you're 16 or older. Annual licenses allow you to fish from March 1 to the last day of February the following year. Lower-cost licenses are available for shorter time

periods. There is an added cost to fish for trout, salmon or sturgeon.

In most cases, Minnesotans don't need a license if you're fishing in a state park. The DNR's complete listing of fishing licenses can help you decide what to buy. For more information, please visit the MN DNR website: www.dnr.state.mn.us/fishing/index.html



SHELTER REMOVAL DEADLINES

In Chisago County, dark houses, fish houses and portables must be off the ice **no later than** 11:59pm on March 4, 2024. County sheriffs may prohibit or restrict the use of motorized vehicles if dangerous ice conditions are present.

ICE IS NEVER 100% SAFE! Recommended Minimum Ice Thickness

Looking ahead at the work we have before us in 2024, Lindström's Staff, Council and Commissions have begun to work on the priorities that emerged from the SWOT Analysis:

<u>Strength</u> – <u>Developed downtown</u>. Make public investments in downtown Lindström that encourage private investment (good signage, clearly marked public parking, ongoing beautification, and collaboration with business owners).

<u>Weakness</u> - Limited business tax base. The Commercial/Industrial Task Force made recommendations to better position Lindström for future growth and success. The EDA (Economic Development Authority commission) is responsible for moving those recommendations forward.

Opportunity – More Day-Trip Tourists who use our lakes, parks and trails. We need to better understand and meet the needs of those tourists and market more effectively.

Threat - Hwy 8 when vehicles exceed the speed limit or fail to yield at cross-walks. The City Administrator and Council will meet with MNDOT in the spring of 2024 to discuss Lindström's needs and concerns. Hwy 8 is a state-controlled road.

We are also putting the final touches on our 2024/2025 City work plan. This work plan is the direct result of the feedback we received from the SWOT analysis and contains 4 goals with action steps and deliverables for each of the goals. We will have this posted to the City's website as soon as it is completed.

As we move through 2024, keep an eye out for **progress updates/meetings** on the projects this summer. We will also place updates in the City newsletter and on the City's website. 

Utility Billing



Cross Country Skiing, Snow Shoeing & Hiking

The 125-acre Allemansrätt Wilderness

The snowmobile trail runs alongside sections of the trail, so be sure to stay on the cycling and pedestrian side of the trail when exploring this local treasure.

Snowmobiling

There are many trails in the area for snowmobiling, which are primarily groomed and maintained by members of the <u>Wild</u> <u>River Snowmobile Club</u>. Depending upon conditions, the trail may open later in the season than anticipated, and could also close temporarily after being opened for the season.

Please respect private property so we can keep the trails that we have. This includes staying on the trail **at all times**, as well as not utilizing the trails when private land owners have closed the trail gates.

We rely ENTIRELY on private landowners for our trail system. *Thank them by not trespassing!*

Ice Safety

White ice or "snow ice" is only about half as strong as new clear ice. Double the below thickness guidelines when traveling on white ice.



Temperature, snow cover, currents, springs, and rough fish all affect the relative safety of ice. Ice is seldom the same thickness over a single body of water; make sure to check the ice at least every 150 feet. Lindström's City Council

Judy Chartrand, Mayor (2023-2024)



Mayor Chartrand is the first female Mayor in the history of Lindström. Her first term as Mayor began on March 3, 2023. She served as a City Council Member immediately prior to her appointment to Mayor. She previously served as a Lindström Park Commission Member as well as a Lindström Planning Commission Member.

Winter Parking

• From November 1st to April 15th there is **NO PARKING** allowed on city streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am or during snow events. This allows our crew to be able to plow in front of your house without having to plow around your vehicles.



- During a snow event, please avoid parking on city streets until the plows have cleared the road.
- If you live in downtown and use the city-owned Park Street Parking Lot for parking, you will need to obtain a winter parking pass. Please contact the <u>Lakes Area Police Department</u> for more information using their non-emergency number 651-257-0622 or stop in at <u>City Hall</u>.

Protect Your Mailbox

- Mailboxes that protrude into the street are hard to avoid when snowplowing. Please
 make sure that your mailbox is the appropriate distance from the curb. Click <u>HERE</u>
 for specific USPS mailbox requirements and measurements.
- Most mailbox damage occurs from **the weight of the snow** <u>not</u> from being hit by the plow blade. Consider replacing your mailbox with a swing style post.



Snow Plowing

- If your lot is curved, please place reflective markers near the curb to help guide the snowplows.
- DO NOT plow or shovel snow across streets or into a Right of Way. This is referred to as <u>"snow-pushing"</u> and it is **illegal.**
- Any personal property located within the Right of Way, including garbage cans, are subject to plowing damage. *Garbage cans need to be placed in the driveway, not in the street.*

Snow Plow Safety Tips

Driving too close to snow removal equipment can be extremely dangerous. Follow at a safe distance (at least 5 car lengths away), yield to snowplows, never drive into a snow cloud, and do not use cruise control on wet or icy roads. Avoid passing snowplows, and be patient. Plows travel slower than posted speeds. Stay alert—a snowplow weighs 17 times more than a car! Assume plow truck drivers cannot see you. During a snow event, please avoid parking on city streets until the plows have cleared the road.

Keep Your Fire Hydrant Cleared

If you have a fire hydrant in your yard, please keep a 3-foot path cleared of snow around the hydrant, clear the hydrant of ice and snow, and keep a path shoveled from the hydrant to the street- and is the responsibility of the Property Owner.

Firefighters need to be able to **locate AND access** the fire hydrant quickly in case there is an emergency. Do your part and reveal the red. *Thank you!*



Winter Shoveling

- **Property owners** are responsible to clear the sidewalks adjacent to their property of snow and ice **within 24 hours** of a snowfall event. For the benefit and safety of all pedestrians, please adhere to this **City Ordinance** (Ordinances 93.01 & 93.18).
- Help your neighbors out, especially if you know they are gone or are elderly. Consider clearing their sidewalks & driveways.

Snowmobiles, ATV's & Golf Carts

- Snowmobiles, ATV's and golf carts are not allowed to travel on sidewalks, in city parks, or on private property without permission. Click **HERE** for complete City Ordinance information.
- Snowmobiles, ATV's and golf carts may operate upon the most right-hand lane of a municipal street or alley & may, in passing or making a left turn, operate on other lanes which are used for vehicle traffic in the same direction for purposes of going to or returning from a non-highway area of permissible operation by the most direct route.
- Snowmobiles, ATV's and golf carts shall only be allowed to travel on City Streets during the winter season, beginning November 1st through March 31st of each year.
