We can also set-up your utility bill account to automatically withdraw your payment from your checking or savings account on the due date.

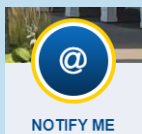
Credit/debit cards, checks and cash are accepted in person at City Hall, or call City Hall to pay with a debit/credit card.

Lindström's Water Tower To Be Repainted

The City of Lindström's functional water tower (not the downtown coffee pot water tower) is due for a complete overhaul.



It has been 17 years since the last time it was overhauled, and 15-20 years is the average timeframe for this type of maintenance.

Because repainting the exterior is part of this maintenance, the project was moved from 2020 to 2021. This delay allowed for

the new Lindström logo to be utilized instead of repainting the existing design.

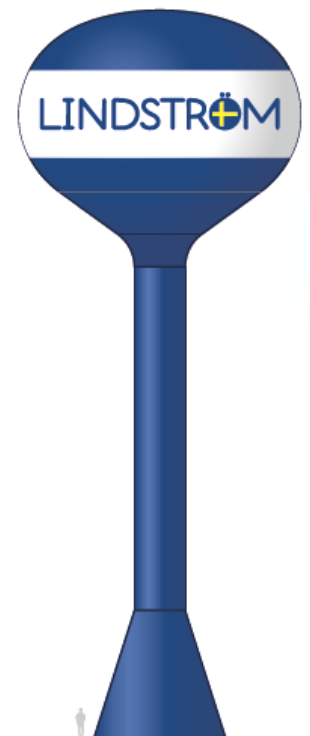
The project was then delayed an additional year due to the contractor's scheduling backlog. Antennas owned by Sprint also needed to be removed, which was not completed by Sprint until last month.

The interior maintenance includes a washout and sand blast. Epoxy paint will then be reapplied to the interior.

Because the water supply will be temporarily stored in the city's wells rather than the water tower, water pressure may vary. **This project will not affect water supply or water quality.**

2022 Primary And General Election Information

Federal, State, and City Elections are held in even years every two years.

Primary Elections are the second Tuesday in August. **2022 Primary Election: Tuesday, August 9, 2022 from 7am-8pm**

General Elections are on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November. **2022 General Election: Tuesday, November 8, 2022 from 7am-8pm**

General Election filing dates for candidates for Lindstrom are August 2 to August 16, 2022. File at Lindstrom City Hall.

Residents within CITY LIMITS of Lindstrom vote at the Lindstrom Community Center at Lindstrom City Hall [13292 Sylvan Ave, Lindstrom, MN 55045](#) (click for Google Maps).

If you are unsure of your voting location, or if your physical address is Lindstrom but you are actually located in a township, please click [HERE](#) to locate your correct polling place.



Are you a registered voter?

You can wait until Election Day to register in Minnesota. However, we encourage you to register before Election Day - it will save you time at the polling place. The deadline to Pre-Register is 21 days before the election. To find out if you are registered to vote, click [HERE](#). To register to vote or to update your registration, click [HERE](#). You can also register or re-register at your designated polling place the day of the election.

If you have moved, changed your name, or have not voted in the last 4 years, you will need to re-register. To learn more about what documentation is needed to register in person at your polling place on Election Day, click [HERE](#).

POLLING PLACE RULES:

- **Do not campaign in or near the polling place.** You have the right to vote without anyone in the polling place trying to influence your vote.
- **No opinions or political discussion** is to take place at the polls – neither by the judges, nor by the voters.
- **Do not wear campaign materials.** In the polling place, you cannot display campaign t-shirts, buttons or literature which relate to specific candidates, official political parties, or ballot questions on the ballot that day. You will need to either cover up or remove these items while in the polling place.
- **Do not enter a polling place unless you are authorized.** Only authorized people are allowed inside a polling place during voting hours, such as voters and their minor children, poll workers and someone assisting a voter. People may not gather or linger in the polling place or within 100 feet of the building.

City Projects & Development Updates

Golf Estates- Multiple homes are under construction.

Lindstrom Fire Hall- Construction continues. Completion is anticipated for December 2022.

Lindstrom Police Hall- The City's Bonding Bill request for \$3,000,000 of State Bonding Bill money was included in the Governor's Bonding Bill request. The legislature failed to approve a bonding bill. We await next steps.

Maple Street- A one-way demonstration will be done this summer. In neighborhood meetings a few years ago, several residents requested this street to be converted into a one-way as a part of an anticipated future reconstruction project. To make sure this change works well for residents, the city will put up temporary barriers to simulate a permanent change.

Meredees/Peninsula- The developer's request for an amended CUP was approved in July. The city is awaiting the final plat and required fees from the developer by the October deadline.

Morning Sun Phase 4- Construction began in June.

Newlander/Elm Street Reconstruction- This project began in mid-June. To receive water shut-off notifications and other important notices that affect the reconstruction zone and surrounding areas, subscribe to our city emails (click [HERE](#)).

Oak Street and Highway 8 Lot- The City received a letter of intent for a six-month timeframe for a developer to propose a multi-million-dollar building. Potential development plans have not yet been received.

Olinda Apartments- The building is occupied. The final stages of restoration and clean up is currently underway.

Olinda Trail Multi-Use Trail (CSAH 25)- Nearly complete. A few of the curbs needed to be redone, and the railing at the retaining wall is on backorder until sometime in August. To learn more about the project click [HERE](#).

Park Street Parking Lot Utility Undergrounding- Engineering has started on this project, and plans should be received soon.

Twin Oaks/Lyman Court Phase Two- Construction began in July.

Veteran's Housing (Tingsryd Gardens)- The preliminary plat has been approved but there remains a \$500,000 gap.

New Beach Park Kayak Dock & Boat Slip

With all of the amenities available at [Lindström's Beach Park](#), access for boaters and kayakers is difficult. The park is on the [Chisago Lakes Water Trail](#), but there is currently no public dock available. Boaters and kayakers are limited to beaching their watercraft on shore at Beach Park, which can be cumbersome.

The DNR-owned fishing pier that is located at Beach Park is strictly for pedestrians, therefore water craft are not allowed to tie up to the structure.

During the first week of August, the city will be installing a kayak dock

and boat slip between the fishing pier and the beach. This will allow for safer and easier access at this pivotal location. The kayak docking system's



innovative design adjusts to shifting water levels, and paddle notches assist with steady entry, exit, easy docking and launching.

The boat slip will accommodate up to five boats, depending upon the size of the water crafts and how boaters choose to tie up to the dock. The dock also adjusts to shifting water levels, even under rough water conditions.

The modular design allows for easy reconfiguration or expansion at any time, and is low maintenance, slip-resistant, and very durable. This new dock is a welcomed asset to our busy Beach Park.

Summer Notices & Reminders

Periodic Street Sweeping & Fire Hydrant Flushing

Occasional street sweeping & hydrant flushing may be needed throughout the summer.

- The street sweeper moves very slow, so please keep a safe distance. If possible, avoid on-street parking while street sweeping is in progress, as this allows the sweeper to do a more thorough job.
- Hydrant flushing can cause temporary low water pressure, which should resume to normal pressure shortly after the process is finished. “Spitting” or slight water discoloration can occur. If you experience this, let your water run for a short period of time to clear the pipes within your home.



Weed Elimination & Grass Cutting

Weeds and grasses are not allowed to exceed a height of **8 inches**. Any expenses incurred by the City when performing enforcement and/or cutting will be imposed on the Property Owner.

Noxious weeds and rank vegetation (click for definition) are considered a nuisance according to **City Code**. Property Owners shall prevent the growth of noxious weeds and remove all noxious weeds on land outside of the traveled portion of any Street or Alley within City Limits. If said weeds are not destroyed by the Property Owner, the City may remove them at the Property Owner's expense.



The term “weeds” does **NOT** include shrubs, trees, cultivated plants or crops. **Prairies**, as well as **butterfly & pollinator gardens** are considered cultivated plants **if** the vegetation is **not listed** in the definition of **“noxious weeds and rank vegetation”**, **AND** are planted in a **cultivated** manner.

Recreational Fires

[See Ordinances 93.60-93.70](#)

Recreational fires are only permitted if they meet the following conditions:

- Fires must be small- no more than 3 feet in height and diameter.
- A non-combustible fire ring shall completely surround the fire area, and must be depressed below the ground. Materials such as cement, brick, blocks, etc. are recommended materials.
- Fires may not be located closer than 25 feet from any structure.
- Additional conditions apply. See [Ordinances](#) for more info.



All other fires require an Open Burning Permit. Recreational fires or [open burning](#) will not be allowed when the City of Lindström, the [Minnesota Pollution Control Agency](#), or the [MN Department of Natural Resources](#) has officially declared a burning ban due to potentially hazardous fire conditions or air quality alerts. Noise Ordinances

Noise from electronics, instruments, operation of equipment, gathering of people, etc. is not allowed between the hours of 10pm and 7am within the City Limits. Curfews and Park hours are also enforced. (Ordinances [93.18](#), [130.02](#), [94.02](#))

Landscaping Water Conservation Tips

- Select hardy plants and grasses that don't need as much water. Try native plants, and mulch plants heavily.
- Fertilizers increase water consumption. Apply the minimum amount needed.
- Plant trees strategically in your yard to help shade your home and yard. This will help to reduce energy use in your home and reduces water needs in your yard.
- Catch rain from your roof with a rain barrel and use this water for your plants and garden.
- Put 3 to 4 inches of mulch around trees and shrubs to help retain moisture and keep the ground cool.
- Place "thirstier" plants near the house where they can receive moisture from roof runoff.
- Letting your grass grow higher in dry weather saves water and helps to prevent your lawn from "burning". Taller grass shades the roots and holds soil moisture better than short grass. Ordinances limit length to 8".
- Use drip irrigation systems, timers, and rain sensors.
- Aerate your lawn periodically. Holes every 6" will allow water to reach the roots rather than run off the surface.
- Recycle your grass clippings into your lawn by using a mulching mower. You'll not only conserve water, but you'll also save time while mowing.
- Water your lawn early in the morning to prevent water loss from evaporation. Watering once or twice a week encourages deeper roots.



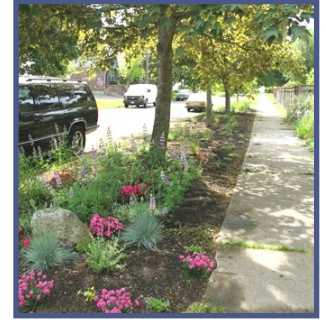

Right-of-Way Planting

The City of Lindström prohibits planting of trees or other vegetation in the boulevard (road right-of-way). Trees and other vegetation may be planted and maintained in drainage and utility easements without a permit from the city at the risk of the property owner and provided that the trees or vegetation do not interfere with access to or use of the easement. ([Ordinance 90.23](#))



Storm Drain Care

- Residents are urged not to blow leaves, grass, dirt, or other debris into the streets. This material can wash into the catch-basins and storm drains, causing them to become clogged and not function properly.
- This debris can also end up in our lakes, which results in excessive algae growth. To learn more about lake preservation, water quality and more, visit the [Chisago County Lake Improvement District \(CL LID\)](#) website.

Weather permitting, the Lakes Area Compost Site is open from mid-April through the Saturday before Thanksgiving. Operating hours are Wednesdays 2pm - 7pm (or dusk), Saturdays 9am - 4pm, and Sundays 1pm - 4pm. The site may temporarily close during inclement weather.

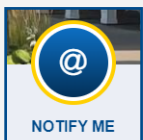
- **Allowed:** Grass clippings, leaves, and brush up to 3” in diameter
- **NOT Allowed:** Dimensional lumber, tires, appliances or household trash
- If available, wood chips, compost and black dirt are available for non-commercial use (for free!)
- No commercial businesses are allowed to haul to or from the site.
