

Water Tower Overhaul Complete

The City of Lindström's functional water tower (not the downtown coffee pot water tower) was due for a complete overhaul this year, which included both interior and exterior maintenance and repainting.

It has been 17 years since the last time it was overhauled, and 15-20 years is the average

timeframe for this type of maintenance.

Work was completed in late October, and the city's new logo was used. Our design will be submitted for a national water tower design contest in 2023, so look for updates in future E-newsletters on how you can cast your vote.



LFD Fire Hall Update

Progress is being made on Lindström's new fire hall, which is located at the corner of Akerson St. and Newlander Ave., just 1 block south of City Hall.

The remaining exterior work, doors and landscaping should be completed soon. The project is still on schedule to be completed by the end of the year, with a move in timeframe of late winter/early spring. Watch for info on their grand opening in future newsletters!

POLLING PLACE RULES:

- Do not campaign in or near the polling place. You have the right to vote without anyone in the polling place trying to influence your vote.
- No opinions or political discussion is to take place at the polls – neither by the judges, nor by the voters.
- Do not wear campaign materials. In the polling place, you cannot display campaign t-shirts, buttons or literature which relate to specific candidates, official political parties, or ballot questions on the ballot that day. You will need to either cover up

- or remove these items while in the polling place.
- Do not enter a polling place unless you are authorized. Only authorized people are allowed inside a polling place during voting hours, such as voters and their minor children, poll workers and someone assisting a voter. People may not gather or linger in the polling place or within 100 feet of the building.

Holiday string lights **contain glass, plastic, copper, and even lead**, all of which can harm the environment. Please dispose of unwanted holiday string lighting at the **Chisago County Household Hazardous Waste Facility (39649 Grand Ave., North Branch)**, every non-holiday Monday 12-7pm. Other unwanted holiday lighting such as candles or figures should go in the trash.


Mailbox Requirements

Mailboxes that protrude into the street are hard to avoid when plowing. Follow these tips to prevent damage to your mailbox.

- The base of the box should be 48"-50" above street level, the mailbox should be secured to the base and post, and the post should be in good condition.
- The post must be 20" back from the curb. The face of the mailbox should line up with the curb.
- The snowplow wing needs the 48" height clearance to avoid hitting the box and the 20" from the curb to clear the post. The city does not assume liability for mailboxes

- damaged during plowing operations, unless it is determined the plow made direct contact with a mailbox that is properly installed using the standard 4 x 4 post and metal box requirements.
- There should not be any plastic newspaper tubes or attachments to the mailbox below the 44" minimum height requirement.
- Most mailbox damage occurs from the weight of the snow- not from being hit by the plow blade.
 Consider replacing your mailbox with a swing style post.

Winter Parking

• From November 1st to April 15th there is **NO PARKING** allowed on city streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am or during snow events. This allows our crew to be able to plow in front of your house without having to plow around your vehicles.

Snowmobiles, ATVs & Golf Carts

- Snowmobiles, ATV's and golf carts are not allowed to travel on sidewalks, in city parks, or on private property without permission.
- Snowmobiles, ATV's and golf carts may operate
 upon the most right-hand lane of a municipal street
 or alley & may, in passing or making a left turn,
 operate on other lanes which are used for vehicle
 traffic in the same direction for purposes of going to
 or returning from a non-highway area of permissible
 operation by the most direct route.
- Snowmobiles, ATV's and golf carts shall only be allowed to travel on City Streets during the winter season, beginning November 1st through March 31st of each year.

Snow Plowing

- Consider replacing your mailbox with a swing style post. This helps prevent it being broken by the weight of the snow.
- If your lot is curved, please place reflective markers near the curb to help guide the snowplows.



- DO NOT plow or shovel snow across streets or into a Right of Way. It is illegal.
- Any personal property located within the Right of Way, including garbage cans, are subject to plowing damage. Garbage cans need to be placed in the driveway, not in the street.

Winter Shoveling

- Snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours of a snowfall.
- Property owners are responsible for the sidewalks that are adjacent to their property.
- Help your neighbors out, especially if you know they are gone or are elderly. Consider clearing their sidewalks & driveways. Thanks for being a good neighbor!



Keep Your Fire Hydrant Cleared

If you have a fire hydrant in your yard, please keep a 3-foot path cleared of snow around the hydrant, clear the hydrant of ice and snow, and keep a path shoveled from the hydrant to the street.

Firefighters need to be able to **locate AND access** the fire hydrant quickly in case there is an emergency. Do your part and reveal the red. *Thank you!*



Clearing Your Neighborhood's Storm Drain

Storm drain systems are designed to move excess rain and ground water from paved streets, parking lots, sidewalks, and walking paths. These storm drains are usually fed by street gutters, which are often fed by excess water flow coming from guttering systems on both houses and commercial buildings. In order to help prevent yard and street flooding, please periodically check the storm water drains in front of your house for debris and clear off as needed.
